- Decent income

Why Germany

- Top Ranked
 - ✓ Quality of Life: Ranked 4th after Switzerland, Japan, and Canada
 - ✓ Predictability and stability: inflation rate: 1,4%, unemployment rate: 4,5%
 - ✓ Purchasing power: ranked 5th in the world
- Shengen access (for non-EU citizens)
 - ✓ Freedom of travel within 26 Schengen countries:
 - > EU is **not** the same as Schengen
 - > The Schengen zone countries which are not an EU member state: Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Norway, and Iceland
 - > The EU member states which do not belong to the Schengen zone: Bulgaria, Romania, Croatia, Cyprus, Ireland
- Permanent Residency (for non-EU citizens)
 - ✓ EU BlueCard and German B1 certificate
 - ✓ EU BlueCard with no knowledge of German
 - ✓ Job visa

Why Germany

- Facillitated residence status (for non-EU citizens)
 - ✓ EU Blue Card min 43.056€ annual gross salary for listed jobs* or min 55.200€ annual gross salary for non-listed jobs; job contract in the field of experties and academic/vocational background
 - Extended career mobility rights in EU states (EU long-term residence permit)
 - Family reunion with no language requirement
 - Permanent residency in 21 months with B1 German certificate, or in 33 months without any German knowledge requirement
 - ✓ Job visa salary in the average range of Germany, job contract in the field of experties and academic/vocational background
 - Family reunion with A1-A2 German certificate -> country-specific
 - Permanent residency in 60 months without any German knowledge requirement

- > Other specializations also acceptable, but higher standards apply as no dire need in the job market
- > The more **social contact** the job requires, the better the **German** should be: *i.e. doctors, psychologists, nurses vs. IT-specialists*
- > Regulated jobs all require German level beyond B2 i.e. medicine, law, psychology, teaching at public high school, etc.



Selection criteria

- ✓ Success in the home country in the same field, with no time gap
- ✓ Minimum 2 years of work experience
- ✓ Max 35 years of age
- ✓ Very good English (B2-C1) or very good German (B2-C1) for entering the job market in Germany



Entry Types (for non-EU professionals)

Job seeking:

6-months-long job seeker visa with at least a bachelor's degree* and min 2 years of work experience. Best suited for: IT-Specialists, Engineers, Researchers

Directly recruited overseas:

Entering Germany with a **job offer** and a job visa up to 4 years (if applicable), to directly start working for an employer. Best suited for IT-Specialists and engineers

Preparation for Qualification Recognition:

for those who do not receive a full recognition of their qualification, i.e. to acquire certain level of German or pass certain recognition exam (Medicine: approbation/FSP)

18 months qualification program, with the possibility to extend for 6 months afterwards, at least a bachelor's degree in a regulated job and min. 2 years of work experience, demonstrated minimum level of German: country-specific, but min. across the globe: at least A2 German, Best suited for: Doctors, Dentists, Nurses, Pharmacists

^{*}IT-Experts can provide certificates instead of academic degree, B1-German and 3 years of work experience

2. Recognition Process*: 850€ within 12 weeks

- Document preparation Checklist (DPC)
- Correspondence with relevant authorities in Germany
- Academic recognition application
- Recognition certificate
- * Mandatory for all CPP applicants



3. Visa assistance process: 500€

- Invitation Letter to Career Pathway Programme
- ❖ Identification of documents to present the German Consulate
- Assistance in booking an appointment, setting up the blocked
 bank account and getting health insurance in Germany
- Review and **revise** the visa application form & documents



4. Arrival assistance process: variable fee

- ❖ Airport Pick-up
- Accommodation during the language course
- Address registration at the city hall
- Cultural events

6. Career Coaching: 1700€

- Forwarding application to recruiting partners
- Finding and analyzing the job postings and active sourcing options (head hunters)
- Customizing application documents incl. keyword and text optimizations of cover letter
- Mock interview in English and/or German and interview tips
- Training on contractual terms, standards, and negotiation potentials
- Contract review and elaboration of negotiation potentials



7. Settle-Down Package: 1800€

- Accomodation search and contract review
- Residence Permit / BlueCard application guidance
- ❖ Contract reviews, such as DSL, Simcard, Electricity, etc.



8. Family Reunion package: 1500€ or 2500€ or 3000€

THE ENROLLMENT PROCESS



Pre-evaluation

Sales team to collect required documents for pre-evaluation:

- ✓ Pre-evaluation form
- ✓ CV AND Motivation letter in English or German
- ✓ ALL Academic degree(s) and transcript(s) in original language
- ✓ Certificate(s) of employment and performance report(s) in original language
- ✓ Language Certificate or course attendance certificate (if available)



Submission Process

✓ Sales team uploads complete information via the online Zoho platform

Job-Seeker Eligibility Form (ETA) reception w/in 72 working hours

- ✓ Applicant to confirm acceptance of the offer & proceed with the payment within 5 days
- ✓ Recognition Process starts upon payment reception => takes 12-16 weeks



✓ C.C. team to enroll the applicant into ALPADIA Career Pathway Programme

- Standard 20 (C20) & TELC Prep
- Intensive 25 (C25) & TELC Prep
- Premium 30 (C30) & TELC Prep

- ✓ NOT into Regular Course
- ✓ Specific Courses: telc-Med & telc-Pro (in accordance with ETA)
- ✓ Enrollment ONLY in accordance with ETA
