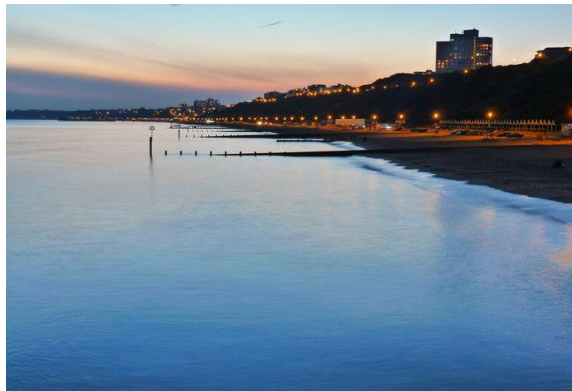

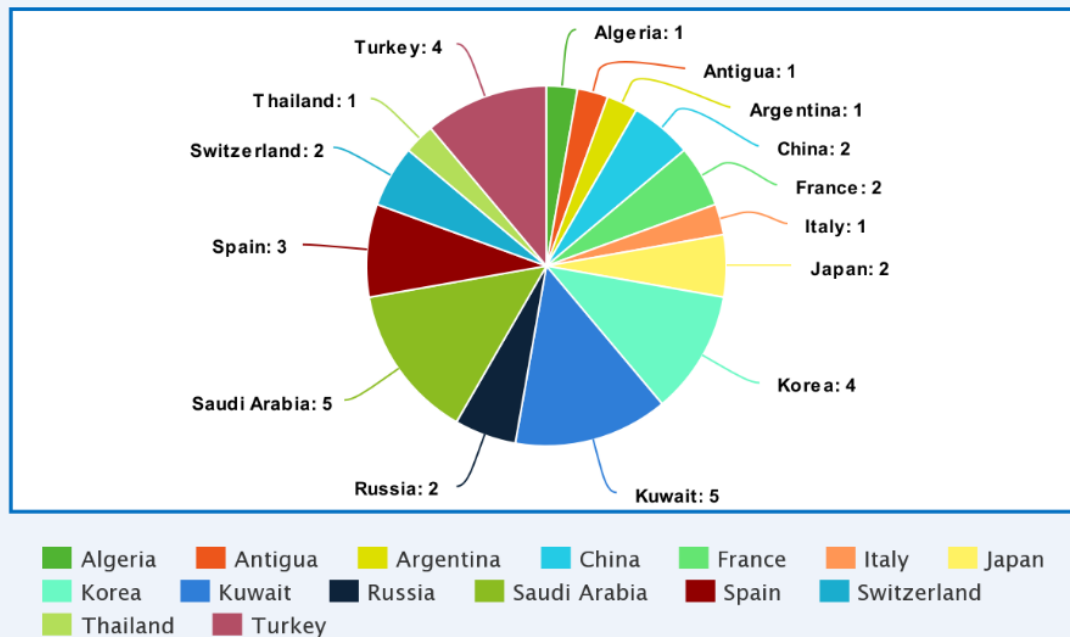

Korean Gestures by Hyeun Song

Twisting your wrist upside down in front of your mouth is a very common gesture (second photo) in Korea. Because of the Korean national alcohol named "Soju", we use this gesture to suggest drinking some alcohol. During drinking Soju, we use our thumb and index finger to grip the glass called "Soju-jan" (first photo). That is why we fold our thumb and index finger when we do this gesture. During this gesture you can also fold all the fingers, it means the same as the above being mentioned one. But most Koreans use this gesture by folding their thumb and index finger.

You can only use this gesture in friends or peers. If you use this gesture to someone who is older than you or needs to show some respect, it looks quite rude. Don't forget to do this only with your peers!

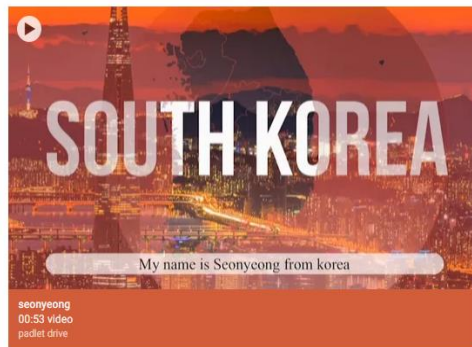

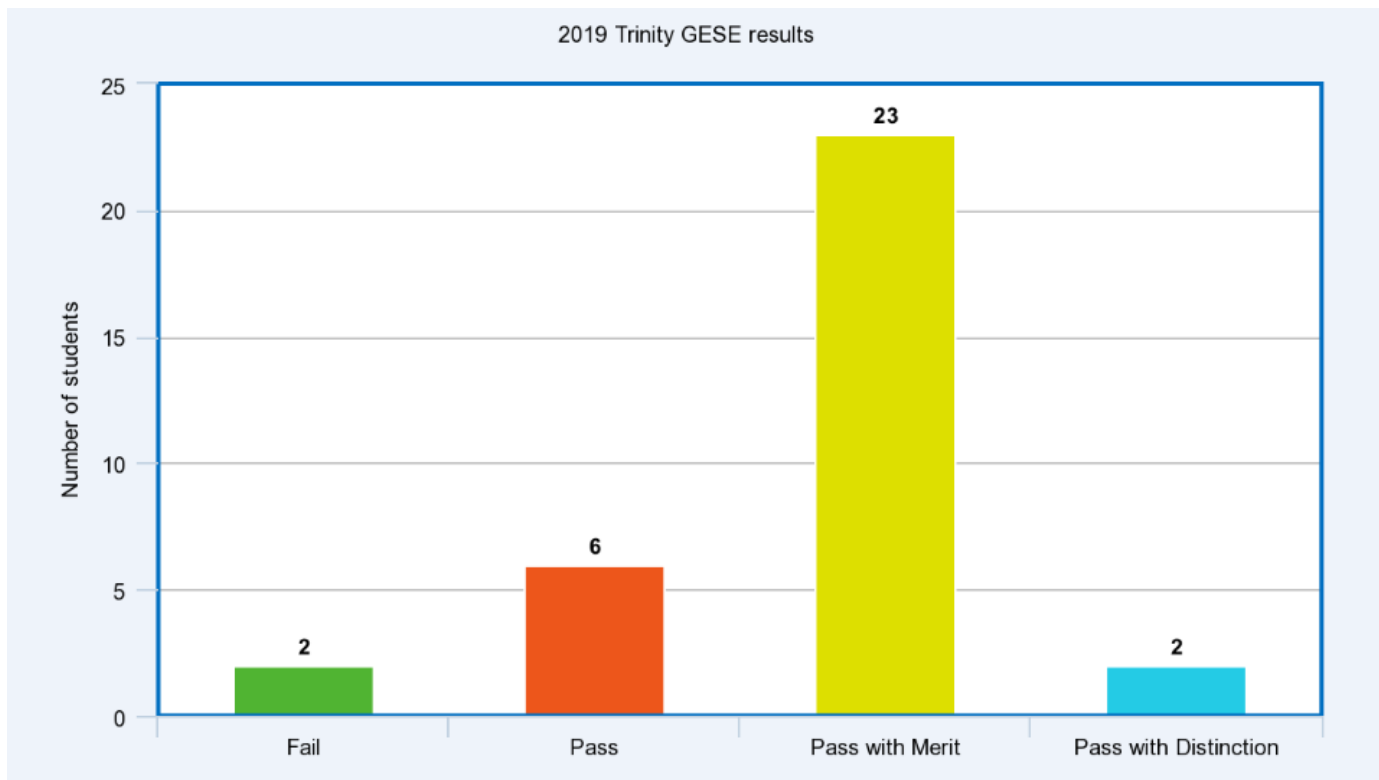
